

58N 7W is on top of a crag to the east of and overlooking Loch Bràigh Bheagarais on the Isle of Harris. Although I managed to climb onto the crag the January wind was brutally strong at the exposed top, with a sustained wind that made it unsafe for me to stand, let alone take pictures. Added to this was the slight problem of a persistent cloud starting just above the loch surface. Although I sat and waited some time for a gap in the weather to reveal what I hoped would be a magnificent view I had to back off when my companion, rather than following me up, started called me back from below, concerned with becoming benighted and somewhat agitated at my long disappearance!

On the way out, however, I did look back from the tail of the lake to see what looked to me like a grisly pile of skulls of assorted sizes. Perhaps a warning I missed on the way in.

“Mull of Skulls” image was taken at 57°59'55.3"N 7°00'08.0"W. The intersection is 195m away in the murky gloom at the top right-hand side of the picture in a north-easterly direction.
