

RO report 2026 for the SE RPS region for the year ending Q4/2025

1. Our events in 2025 and our proposed programme for 2026

We stuck very much to our proposed programme, which reflects the current thinking for events. We based our programme on the following:

- a majority of click events, which were meet-ups which entailed only paying an entrance or car park fee
- a few face to face events, which are generally workshops, which are paid for
- a few Zoom events, which were a mix of free to attend or paid for

We wrestled with the click events after a few people cancelled at the last minute for our meet up in London. The winner is undoubtedly that we want to keep these events free and see no point in introducing a charge.

There are two lessons from 2025. Firstly, we need to give people plenty of notice, and secondly, even if the event is sponsored by another body, as was the case for the Bewl Water TWT, we need to market that early and also market it ourselves.

2. Committee Member elections

Following an update to the Terms of Reference for Regional Organisations Committees, we are able to stand for 3 years before requiring re-election. Anyone standing down before that 3 years is up, may be replaced by someone co-opted onto the committee.

3. What does the RPS SE and RPS look like from where I'm standing?

The RPS SE looks reasonable but could do with more help. I have been doing this job since 2020 now, and I feel the time is ripe for a change. I would like to see a successor in the next 11 months. Come onto the committee and see what we do.

I outlined our strategy above as:

- a majority of click events (free)
- a few face to face events (paid for)
- a few Zoom events (mix)

This is fairly risk free in terms of finance, which is important in today's operating environment. Should we have more F2F events like ARPS advisory days, AGMs, and/or exhibitions?

We have yet another RPS CEO in place, the third since I took on this role. Let's hope for some positive change.

- We are still using Billetto to book our events after more than 2 years as the RPS system shows no sign of improvement.
- The RPS website is still in the same poor condition as I first saw it many years ago.
- The changes to the ARPS/FRPS distinctions process has thankfully slowed down after, what was in my opinion, not a great way forward for the LRPS changes in terms of communication and outcome.
