The GRAND PRIX TROPHY

The Grand Prix Trophy is awarded to the winner of the RPS International AV Festival. The Trophy was designed by Lord David Linley, and was generously purchased for the Festival in 1990 by Arthur Packham APAGB, who was the then Chairman of the Festival Committee. He visited Lord Linley's studio to select the design, which is reminiscent of the top of an Ionic column. The Trophy is normally kept at The RPS HQ, and because of its value the winner, if present at the Festival, only gets to be photographed with the Trophy rather than keep it! A board, to accompany the Trophy, was also commissioned from Lord Linley, and records the names of the winners:

THE JURY

Howard Bagshaw ARPS MPAGB (England), Chair of the Jury



I am delighted to be judging the 2021 RPS International, this being the second time I have had this honour. I have also been fortunate enough to have won this competition in 2010 with "Migrant Mother". Since then, I have been very involved with the AV scene. I've been on the RPS AV committee, organised the RPS National AV Championships, lectured in interesting places around the world and entered many International AV competitions, receiving several awards. I also gained my ARPS and MPAGB in Audio Visual. Unfortunately, the Festival this year has to be held 'virtually', which means that, as Judges we have independently viewed the AVs on our home computers. But the power of 'Zoom' has allowed us to share our views and reach our decisions. However, like most of you I suspect, I have missed the opportunity to watch the AVs with an audience and projected onto a 5 metre wide screen. Looking forward to the next time.

Musse Anger (Italy)

I was born in Paris, France, spent a few years in England and for many years I have lived in Florence, Italy. My interest in the audio visual world started 12 years ago when some friends invited me to an AV show, and since then I have enjoyed the medium with great passion. Since 2012, I have been a member of a three female AV group called "Le Fate Ignoranti". We are also part of the group Triangolo Magico Multivisione (www.triangolomultivisione.it) which in 2017 won Italy's National Competition and 2 years ago won the Garda International AV Festival. Le Fate Ignoranti have been active in the production of five digital audio visuals with good results. In 2017 we won the best geographical documentary, at our National Competition, with an AV called Memoria di Quei Giorni. In 2014, I was a member of the Jury at the "International Festival de l'Image", Epinal. I am a member of "GAT" (Gruppo Audiovisivi Toscana), which is a group of enthusiasts that promote AV in the region of Tuscany.



Graham Sergeant FRPS EFIAP FIPF (England)



The documentary film work of John Grierson and Humphrey Jennings was an early inspiration. After many years as an academic sociologist, I served my apprenticeship in film craft with one of my former students who, after college, became a BBC film producer. Together, we set up an independent company to make a variety of sponsored films. That experience and a background as a documentary film producer was invaluable when I joined the AV community. Free from the conventions of TV documentaries and sponsored films, today digital AV offers exciting opportunities as a modern 'essay' form, although I have still enjoyed applying the techniques, I used in making films when producing AVs. In 2016 I was delighted to win the RPS Grand Prix Trophy for my production 'Beeswing' and in 2018 I was awarded the FIAP Gold Medal for 'The Dance Goes On'. The arrival of digital technologies has made AV into an exciting modern medium, which as all AV producers know, is at its best, when pictures and sound come together- the results can be pure magic! I'm looking for high production values and a clear and engaging narrative.
