



The award-winning sequences were then shown, each followed by a comprehensive comment from the judges. The overall winner of the first NIPA International Festival was Malcolm Imhoff with his sequence 'Queen of the Hills' Malcolm was also awarded the first 'Ross Mulholland Memorial Medal' for his sound track. Fitting for an International Festival Letizia Ronconi from Italy was awarded the PAGB Silver medal for her sequence 'Blue AV'.
