Report on Actions from previous AGM

No Actions from AGM



• The overall number of members has increased by 115, a 10.5% rise on the previous year:

• 2020: 915

• 2021: 1028

• 2022: 1030


• 2023: 1065

• 2024: 1180

- This comprised 174 leavers and 289 new members
- A feedback survey is sent to all leavers, and of those who responded the key reasons given are related reducing personal spend and personal health issues



Landscape Group continues to have members in all the UK regions:





• Overseas membership has reduced as an overall percentage. However, this is largely due to the significant increase in members based in the UK. The actual number of overseas members has reduced by 2.

2024 Review –Talk-Walk-Talk

- Talk-Walk-Talk (TWT) collaboration with DIG
 - Building on the success of the first two TWTs
 - Third TWT (Spring) on Architecture and Built Environment (ABE)
 - Mark Reeves FRPS presented the talk
 - 340 participants and 40 walks across the UK
 - 30 International and islands bookings
 - Final selected images published as a zine
 - Fourth TWT (Autumn) on Woodland
 - Paul Mitchell FRPS presented the talk
 - 359 participants and 52 walks across the UK
 - 31 International and islands bookings
 - Final selected images published as a zine
 - More on future plans later



2024 Review – Projects – Sound-Scapes

- Sound-Scapes a joint project with the Audio-Visual Group
 - Sound-Scapes was a project to encourage members to try out a new way of presenting landscape photography

2024 Review – Projects - Calendar

Calendar Project

- First ever calendar
- 120 images submitted
- Season and month appropriate
- Final images chosen by a judging panel
- Calendar was available in time for Christmas
- Will repeat for 2026, more news soon



2024 Review - Projects - The Shipping Forecast

The Shipping Forecast

- Members captured 17 coastlines based on the Shipping Forecast
- A selection of the submitted images were chosen by a judging panel and are now displayed in a web gallery
- We received over 140 images
 - 20 were chosen as winners for their respective sea area
 - Another 26 images were commended
- The project has been extended
- Working with AV Group four special AVs created which will be featured on our website



2024 Review – Member-Led Events

- Member-Led Events (MLEs) have continued to be incredibly popular
- In 2024, we ran 27 events (with 22 sold out) and a total of 200 bookings (before 3 cancellations)
- We have had very positive feedback
- We currently have 29 events launched to date for 2025
- We'd like to run more events, but the limiting factor remains the number of members willing to lead, so please get in touch if you are interested



2024 Review – Professional-Led Events

- Professional-Led Events (PLEs) are also very popular
- We really value working with professional photographers who deliver a superb range of excellent workshops
- These vary from one day workshops to a week-long residential course, which was held on Harris and Lewis in 2024
- 24 in-person events took place in 2024, as well as three online talks



2024 Review – Newsletter and Competitions

- Currently reviewing the Newsletter, update soon
- Regular member emails twice a month
- We continue to run regular competitions, both monthly and themed
 - The monthly competition allows for images taken at any time to be submitted
 - The themed competitions encourage new work to be submitted
- There is a wide variety of themes
 - Current theme is Structures in the Landscape
- Many thanks to our sponsor FotoVUE for very kindly providing one of their excellent photography books for each winner



2024 Review – Circles and Social Media

- Circles continue to prove very popular
 - We now have 106 members across 13 circles
 - The circles cover print, processing, and critique
 - This does not represent 106 unique members as some people are in more than one group,
- Social media is important for us too
 - We have a very active private Facebook group (currently 529 members, up from 510 last year)
 - We also have our public facing Instagram feed (currently 1,743 followers, up from 1,478 followers last year).

Subscription fee

- Subscription fee is reviewed annually, and any change is confirmed to RPS HQ by September each year
- Any change is implemented the following January
- Finance statement
- There have been changes to the basis on which the finances for Special Interest Groups are managed which was implemented during the 2024 year. After consultation with Memcom, and with the agreement of the Group representatives, it was agreed that a management fee would be implemented charged to all groups on a per-capita basis to contribute toward the administrative costs of supporting group activities borne by RPS, as well as the cost of maintaining and developing our platforms and services. As a parallel activity RPS has begun the process of consolidation of individual Group bank accounts into aggregated accounts, to make things easier to manage and reduce banking overheads, although individual Group reserves will be tracked and maintained.
- This fee was implemented from July 1 and the balance in respect to the six months to the end of 2024 was debited from Group bank accounts in December. The management fee for 2025 has been calculated and communicated to Finance Officers and Group Chairs and will be collected monthly, commencing in January 2025, and thereafter will be determined annually based on membership numbers of each Group.
