Halifax

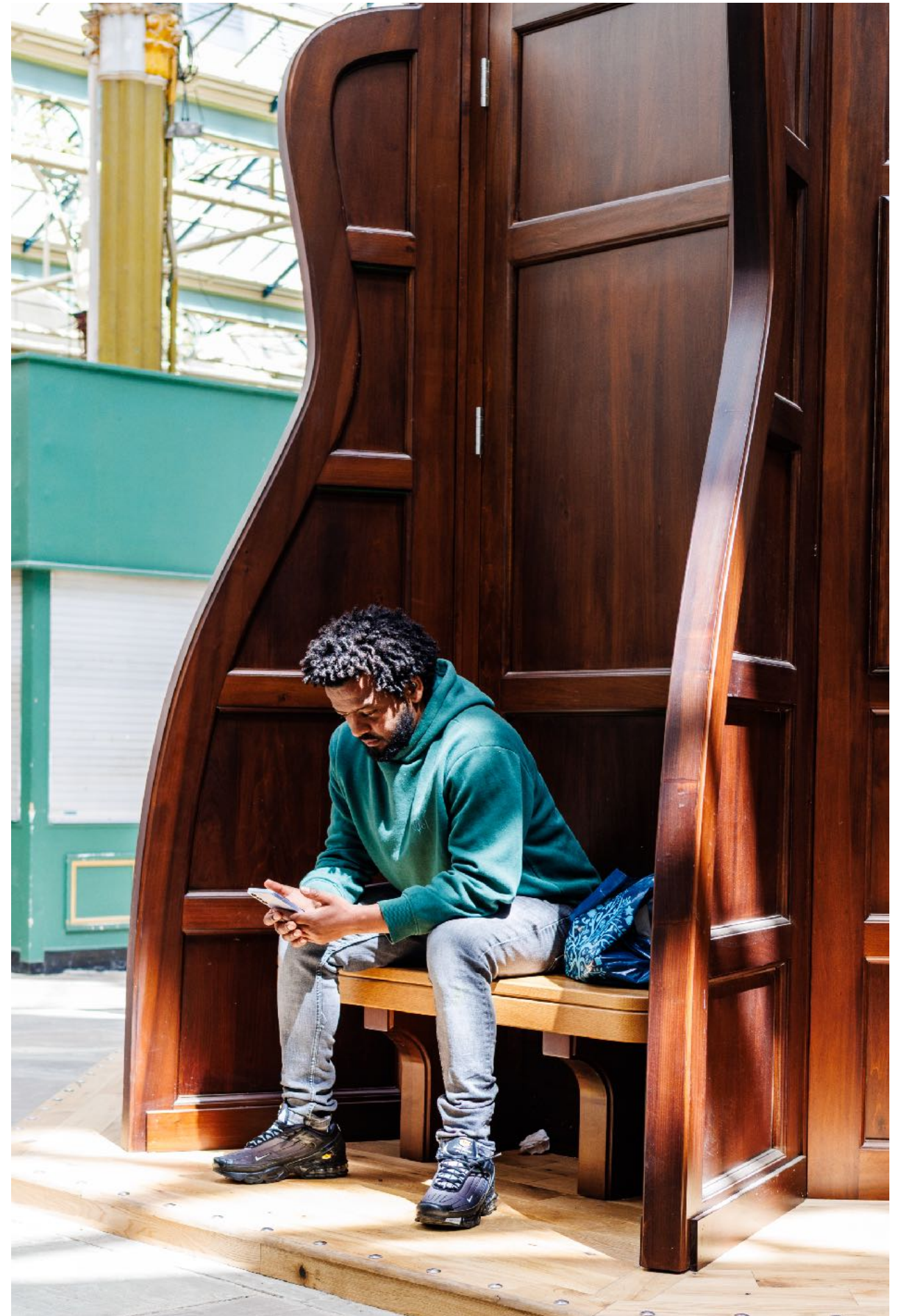
Our visit to Halifax was a game of two parts. We had two days to choose from and eventually half went one day and half the second. Alan went both days! We have contributions from seven members.

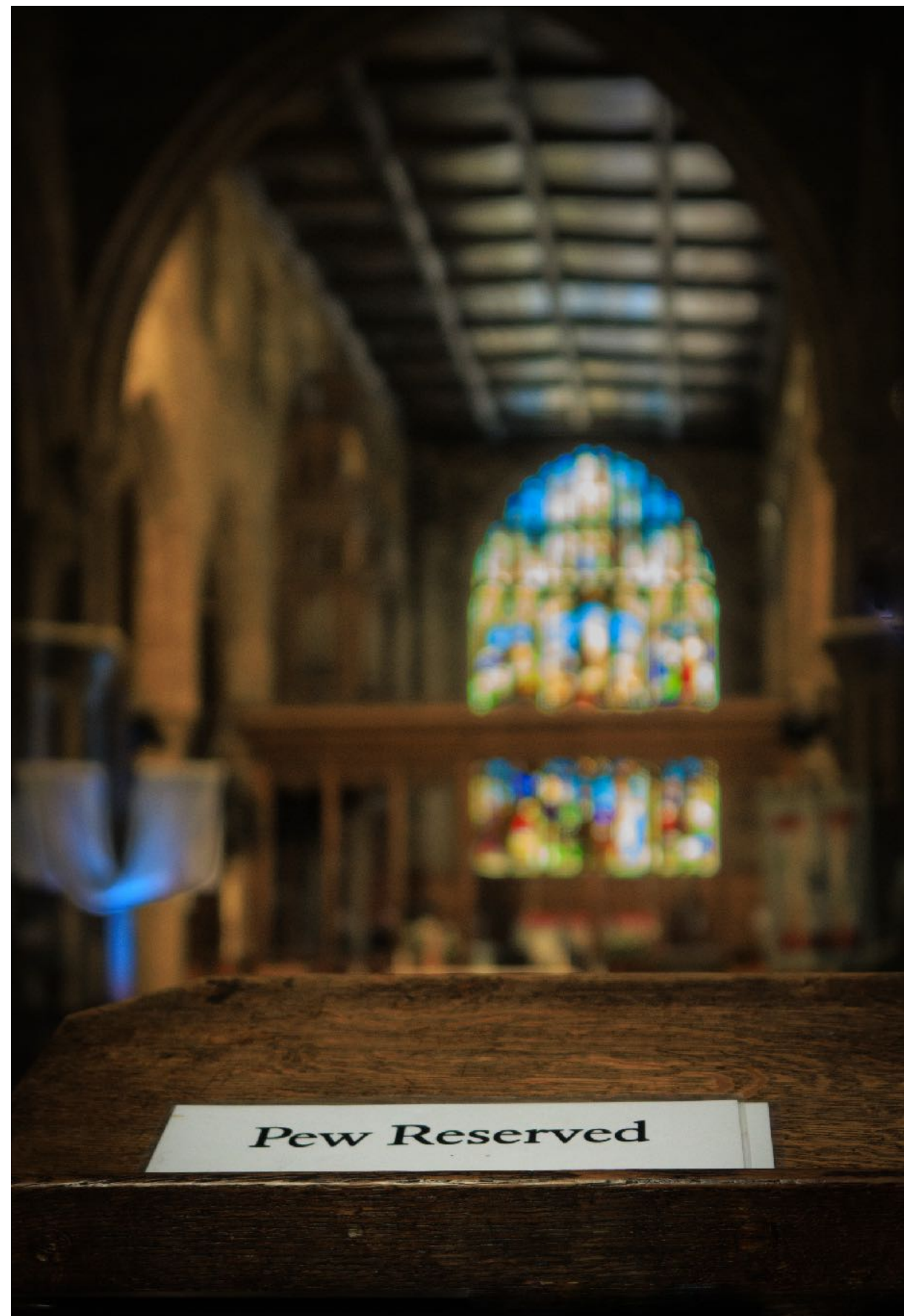

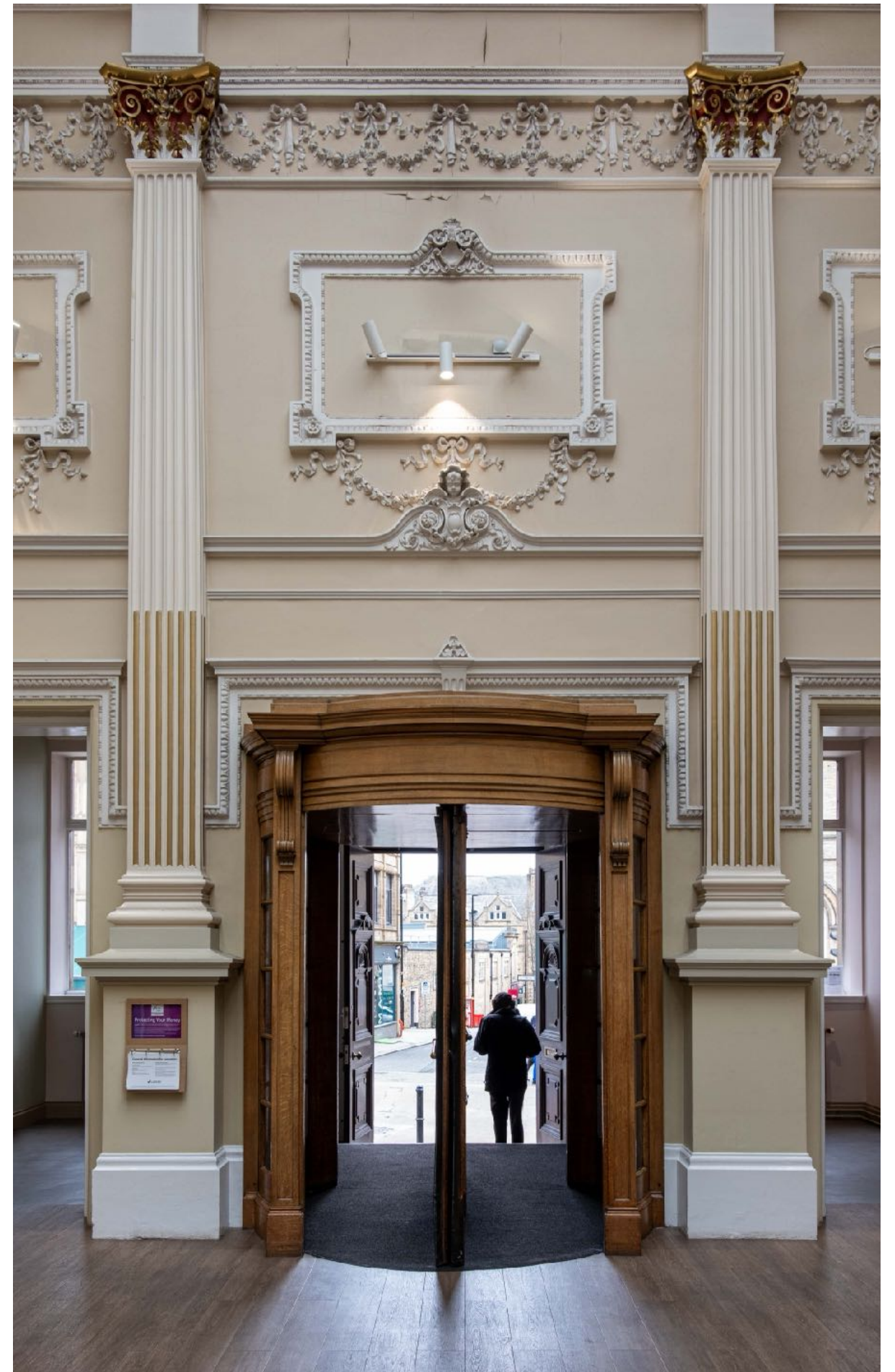

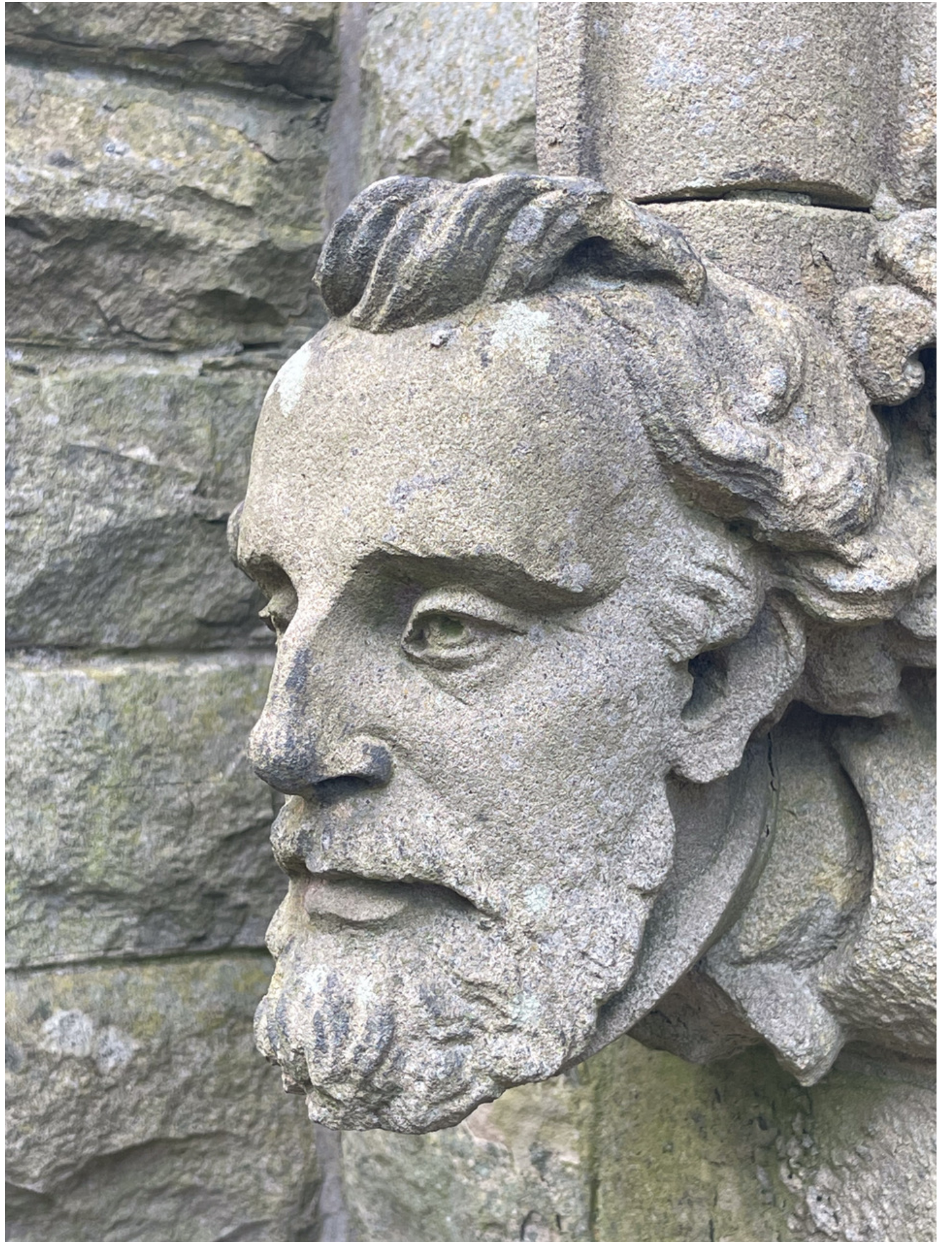
