Writing of the Oxford day, David Short says:

'On Sunday, 18th May a group of photographers from the Travel Group met in Oxford for a morning of photography. We were there to photograph an event known as the Distinguished Gentlemen's Ride against the background of the beautiful colleges and buildings of the 'city of dreaming spires'. The day was suggested and kindly facilitated by group member, John Cavana, who is one of the events official photographers.

The main aim, apart from gentlemen (and ladies) dressed up on their (mostly) vintage motorcycles, is to raise funds and awareness for two charities, namely prostate cancer and mental health. It is a country and worldwide event and has been held every year since 2012.

This year, 127,000 riders in 108 countries around the world raised over seven and a half million dollars. We all found many photo opportunities and came away with some great images. Thanks, John!'

The speakers are lined up and ready to bring some inspiring thinking to their presentations, so we hope you have registered to attend this weekend in the heart of England. If you haven't, please do so very soon, especially if you plan to stay at Woodland Grange as the special hotel rate can only be guaranteed until 9th August (maybe they'll stretch a day or two if you get in quickly!).

All the details were in the February Newsletter and are on the website, where details of the speakers bios can be seen.

Our speakers on Saturday 11th October will bring a range of expertise and will provoke a variety of reactions!

Since he agreed to be one of our speakers Ash Bhardwaj has begun working on Morning Live for the BBC so you may have come across him there if you haven't seen his book, Why We Travel, the 2024 Travel Book of the Year, or watched one of the many documentaries he has been involved in. We will also hear from Sue O'Connell, whose travel images regularly feature in national and international competitions and whose recent travels have included Angola, Bangladesh and Colombia; Nat Coalson who was the judge of our Annual Competition and is a highly regarded tutor and mentor to photographers through his website and in person will share some tips for producing exhibition worthy images and Prof. Lindsay Stringer, will bring us evidence from her own travels of the effect of our travels on the communities we visit.

On Sunday 12th October, the first presentation will be from Leigh Preston FRPS bringing his own unique style to mono and travel photography. He will be followed by Chris Roche sharing his work documenting worship in a range of cultures and Peter Brisley who will share his thinking on the importance of print and the creation of panels of images.

Add to this opportunities to share your work with others through the Bring a Print competition and discussion sessions and the presence of representatives from Epson, Fotospeed and Permajet and you simply can't afford to miss out.

I really like this photo with strong visual and compositional qualities. The composition is simple but effective....

I also love the colour harmony here:
The way that all the subjects' eyes are gazing directly at the camera creates a strong connection, making me feel engaged and curious about the scene. The relaxed posture of both the herder and the camels enhances the storytelling. This image captures an authentic moment with thoughtful composition and striking colours...
