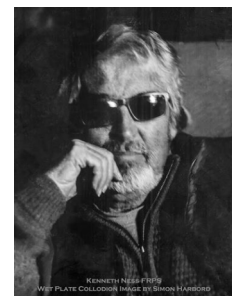


Melanie Chalk - workshops & DI Online editor
