

After the first commercial tape recorders became available to the public, the first amateur recording contests have been held as early as 1949 in France and in Switzerland in 1956, the International Federation of Sound Hunter FICS was founded as a top priority.

Nine European national recorder's associations from East & West joined along with the Federation of British tape Recordists Clubs FBRTC. Although the main interest of sound hunters still consists in mixing and blending of spoken word with special sound effects and music to create interesting sound recordings, they do not remain unconcerned to optical influences: one of the categories of their annual international contest IARC became diaporama (and another became video years later), where the sound track of every entry has a main and strange significance.

Therefore, the International Federation of Sound Hunters is very happy to support their photographer colleagues at their contasts like the 11th Audio-Visual Festival in Bath, where the creation of diaporamas is approached from the pictorial angle to accentuate the visual element.

I am very happy, too to welcome the participants of this famous Festival at Bath and to to remind them that excellent diaporamas consist not only from remarkable visual experience but from excellent sound tracks as well, I am proud that the FICS may donate another Jean Thévenot Medal for the very best sound track of this contest and I would like to congratulate the winner of this prize.
