A new full-time role, offered for an initial 2 year period.

It consists of twenty-one ambitious programmes, all of which are underpinned by supporting aims around inclusion, environmental and social responsibility, member involvement, financial sustainability and profile raising. Some programmes are a continuation of past activities but eleven are new - providing an opportunity for the RPS to engage with new audiences to *inspire*, supporting their *creativity* and *connect* them to a wider community of photographers.

This brand new role is an exciting opportunity to help the RPS develop and deliver a new programme of work specifically for younger people. ### The role

The RPS is seeking to recruit a Photography Engagement Officer who will develop and deliver programmes for young people, providing resources, activities and a network for children and young people interested in photography as well as supporting their teachers and others. As part of this they will also lead on a significant strand of a partnership with Action for Children and a project engaging with young carers for two days per week for up to nine months. The postholder will work closely with our Education and Membership teams and will report to the RPS Education Manager.

#### **Terms**

Salary £22,000, plus non-contributory pension scheme. This is for an initial fixed term of two years. It is full-time role based at our base in Paintworks, Bristol with some home working possible. Evening and weekend working may also be required sometimes. A current driving licence may be an advantage, but is not essential.
