

Since its formation in 1977, the RPS AV Group has grown to become one of the largest and most active Groups in the Royal Photographic Society, and it is now probably the largest Group of AV workers in the world.

Area Organization - This ensures that Members in all parts of the U.K. are within easy access of Group Workshops and AV Days which are held frequently. An examination of The Photographic Journal will inform you how much more active we are than any other RPS Group.

Distinctions - RPS Licentiateship, Associateship and Fellowship Distinctions can be achieved by submitting a programme of Sequences for appraisal by the Slide Sound Sequences Panels of the RPS. Help and guidance in achieving these Distinctions is provided frequently at Area Meetings, and privately by arrangement with AV Group Fellows of the RPS.

AV News - This is the only authoritative British magazine entirely devoted to Slide Sound Sequences. Six issues are produced each year. The way to receive copies regularly is to become a Member of the RPS AV Group.

Definition - The slide-tape format of audio-visual is the projection of 35mm slides using two or more projectors, focused to cover the same screen area. These projected images are linked to sound from a tape and are called sequences. Lasting up to 12 minutes, they can range from interpreting poetry, music or song, to stories and documentaries on any subject. When the projected slides change, blend together or "dissolve" they create a magical transformation. The slide-tape format of audio-visual is regarded as a technique and art in its own right.

Message from the FIAP AV Commission for the 13th RPS Audio-Visual Festival

Many authors of diaporamas affirm : "the diaporama is a personal work". Others advocate that the diaporama is a team product! We arrive so at a paradox : the AV sequence is a personal work realised by a team!

The diaporama is born, is invented by the photographers who saw in it an opportunity to show their colour slides. In the beginning it was the projection in a certain order with adequate music. Later some comments were added to explain, let us say, a trip, a journey. So, step by step, the genuine AV sequence was born. The AV sequence is born at the photographer, but it could be born at the sound hunters or somewhere else, why not?

But in the beginning the diaporama was an image. And the image is an affair of the photographer. So the AV sequence was made by the photographer and by him alone. But this has now changed. The image is only one of the constituents of the achievement.

More than one discipline is need for realising a diaporama. One should have to be a musician, a writer, a speaker, a technician in sound recording. ..., and of course also a photographer. Is it not too much for one author? Who can claim to have enough knowledge and talent to master all these specialities? So it is necessary to work in team so that one can afford and resolve all the problems of the achievement.

But in diaporama one must have an idea, something to communicate. Only one individual can do this. More persons cannot, or do it with difficulty. There would be as many ideas as individuals and this would lead to concessions that would degrade the power of the sequence.

The diaporama can have a beautiful future if it is good enough to retrieve it from the local circle and make it attractive. Many specialised persons are therefore needed and it is only in this way that it can be brought to a large audience like here at the R.P.S. Festival.

Those attending this international event, will appreciate years of friendship not only in the local association, but all over the world. This is why the R.P.S. organises, every two years since 1976, this International Festival.

I hope that this international event will continue to exist in the future. From experience I can say it is a great work and is time consuming. And I thank all persons who have been involved in this great Festival.

Our Federation appreciates very much the excellent visual ideas and perfect slides as well as fading and other special effects employed in top Audio-Visual productions. We feel happy, if we may also contribute to better sound of entries by awarding Jean Thévenot Medals to presentations which demonstrate particularly high creativity, to presentations at which the technical quality of the sound track has significantly contributed to the success of the whole work.



Mollie McConaghy FIPF (Chairman of the Jury), first joined Donaghadee Camera Club in Northern Ireland over 40 years ago, and was inspired to take up making AV sequences in the 1980's following a visit to the Club by Ken Tomlinson FRPS FIPF DPAGB. Success in Northern Ireland lead to her first acceptance in the Nationals in 1989 with "Once Upon a Tree". A further acceptance followed in 1991, and in 1993 her sequence entitled "Murder in Cratla Wood" came fifth. In 1994 Mollie's "The Rocks Remain" came first at the 1994 RPS International Festival, which went on to win the Nationals the following year. Further prizes have been gained at the RPS Festival in 1996 and the Nationals in 1997. Mollie has achieved the highest level of distinction in the Irish Photographic Federation attaining her Fellowship in 1995. Mollie was a founder member and first organiser of the RPS Ireland AV Group and was also joint organiser of the Northern Ireland Photographic Association's Monkstown AV festival.

Ron Davies FRPS, AFIAP is one of the UK's most successful AV workers and has won over 50 international awards including 7 Grand Prix in FIAP patronised Festivals. In 1990 he gained his Fellowship of the RPS with two AV sequences, "Hiraeth" and "Rough Justice" and has subsequently become a member of the RPS Distinctions Panel for Slide Sound Sequences. He was awarded his AFIAP in 1993 and has subsequently gained sufficient points to apply for EFIAP. In 1997 he was Chairman of the Jury at the Nationals and was also invited to lecture on Sports photography and AV at the APSCON Convention in Australia. Ron travels extensively to AV Festivals in Europe, and last year Ron won a silver medal at the Eurofestival at Hayange with his sequence "The Exiled Mind". Earlier this year he was a member of the jury at the Mechelen Festival in Belgium.

Bob Dubois became a member of Acina, a famous AV Club in Belgium in 1981. From an early age he had a great interest in literature and poetry but his greatest interest was in all kinds of music, including songs, classical film and experimental. He thinks that this is a good grounding for anyone wanting to

work in AV. Bob has won many awards starting at club level and progressing through national to international festivals. His awards have included not only those selected by the jury but also those which have been chosen by public vote. Bob has also written several articles about AV for various magazines.

Gerald R S Mee FRSA, FIAC, ARPS has had an interest in photography, particularly film making, since his early school days. He founded Leek Amateur Ciné Society in England in 1940 and later joined Stoke Amateur Ciné Society of which he has been president since 1973. He joined the Institute of Amateur Cinematographers in 1954 and has been a member of its Council since 1967. He has served as President, Chairman, Technical Officer and presently holds the positions of Emeritus Vice-President and Film Music Advisor. Gerald has also worked at regional and international level as chairman & director of various film and video festivals. His own work has brought him awards in film, video, print and slide media and he has served on the juries of many international film and video festivals and as a judge at a number of AV competitions.

Lásló Tám EFIAP is from Hungary and has been active in photography since 1963, and in 1970 started to work in the AV medium. In 1973 he won his first award, in Hamburg, and joined the Hamburg Diaporama Club in 1975. He became a member of the Hungarian Society of Photographers in 1979, the first to specialise in Diaporama. Lásló was a founder member of the Diaporama Group in Pécs and initiator of the Pécs Diaporama Festival. In 1988 he achieved the award of AFIAP with EFIAP following in 1992. He has won over 100 national and international awards including the Vác Festival Trophy (twice) and the Angoulême Festival trophy. Lásló has travelled widely showing his work in 12 countries. His pictures have also been used in books, magazines and on record sleeves. The Hungarian National Television has bought 30 of Lásló's diaporama programmes which are shown regularly.

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Brittany Comes to Cheltenham

For our special event within the Festival weekend, we welcome our guests from Brittany, who will present a multi-projector A.V. Spectacular.

The presenters are a group of people who organise an annual event in Brittany called 'Festival de L'Image du Bout du Monde' - Festival of Images at the End of the World! This is an A.V. Festival held annually at Le Guilvinec, a small fishing port on the west coast of Brittany, in the province of Finisterre. Finisterre means the end of the land and in times of yore was looked upon as an uncivilised outpost of France. Hence the title for their Festival.

However there is nothing uncivilised about the Festival. The event is held in a modern Cultural Centre capable of holding 400 people in banked comfortable seats. A.V. sequences are projected varying in length from two to forty minutes, played on any number of projectors between two and twenty-four! Two comperes do an excellent job of linking the Festival together and keeping everyone informed. After their sequence has been played authors, who are present, are invited to come down and talk about their work to the audience.

The Festival is organised by a team of enthusiasts from the local area under the chairmanship of Maurice Tristan. This group of energetic enthusiasts and very friendly people decided to visit our Festival this year, so we decided to invite them to our Saturday evening entertainment spot. They have agreed and will present a ninety minute programme including their nine projector work in and around Brittany. We can look forward to an excellent and entertaining evening
