

Royal Photographic Society Landscape Exhibition 2022

The Landscape Group of the Royal Photographic Society (RPS) is holding an outdoor exhibition of landscape photographs in cities across the UK. The exhibition comprises c60 prints on 22 panels, totalling a run of almost 25 metres: landscapes, seascapes and cityscapes; from vistas to intimate insights; a mixture of colour, B&W and infrared.

Confirmed dates and locations for the first two locations are:

22nd May to 18th June St Andrew Square in central Edinburgh.

26th June to 10th July Dame Judi Dench Walk*, York.

(*on the Riverside adjacent to Museum Gardens)
