RO's Report – Overview

Organisation

- The London Region 'Official' RO Team remained stable during 2021
- David Hicks as Regional Organiser
- Judy Hicks, Mike Psyllides and Roger Towell as Co-Deputy Regional Organisers
- Jennette Russell as Treasurer.

Region's Membership

- Small decline over 2021 from 1,141 to 1,128 (28th December)
- A drop of just over 1% compared with 4% for RPS overall

Region Organised Activities

- We held 122 events in the year with a total attendance of 2,314
- **484** people attended one or more events (385 in 2020, 452 in 2019).
- **79%** were Members, (80% in 2020).

- Regular (but not same day or every month)

 - Regular follow-ups with Zoom image sharing



Distinctions

- We ran six Online Advisory Days: three for LRPS, three for ARPS
- Through trial and error, the online events run for a maximum of 3.5 hours with 6 panels being reviewed. These smaller events which have proved very successful and popular with both Advisors – and Participants
 - Two Advisors three panels each
 - Allows wider pool of advisors to be used
 - Lowest carbon footprint!
 - Zoom environment is better for understanding composition, content and technical issues
 - But not for "print" quality / issues
 - Video record (for each individual only) to keep or forget!
- We have run a monthly online Study Group for those working towards a Distinction or just starting on their journey – and these have proved popular too.
- We are very appreciative of the time and expertise which the Advisors bring both the participants Advisory sessions and to the Study evening.

RO's Report – Charitable Causes

Cafe Art

- Under Julian's leadership, we have continued to support Cafe Art.
 - although the Calendar programme in its usual form had to be cancelled this year, images were taken using digital cameras and many of the successful images came from members of the Mentoring Group.
- The Mentoring programme continued throughout the year. An Exhibition is on display at the Brixton Library Gallery and the mentoring programme continues twice a month with walks in places such as St James's Park last week followed by on-line reviews a week later.

RO's Report – London Region Members Print Exhibition

- Grown in participation each year
 - First year (2017 for 2018) 44 Members put forward images
 - 2018 for 2019 = 49 and changed to selection by participants
 - 2019 for 2020 = 55
 - 2020 for 2021 = 61
 - This year (2021 for 2022) = 109!!!!
 - 1st Selection Day (20th November) 72 sets too many!
 - Forced to close entries hunted for bigger Exhibition venue!
 - 2nd Selection Day (15th January) 37 sets
 - London Region Members Print Exhibition 2022
 - January (Lauderdale House) 1st Selection Day
 - March (The Camera Club) 2nd Selection Day
 - April (Espacio Gallery) all 109 participants
- Thinking about how to cope with even more participants for 2022-23



RO's Report

Summary

- Again 2021 was not "Business as Usual"
- We have adapted quickly to 'new ways of working' and are developing the "Hybrid" model for our meetings at present.
- Distinctions Advisory Days have continued online with great support from Advisors.
- Online Study Group has proved very popular and successful.
- Photo-walks have largely continued although we have had to put them on hold (or reduced nimbers) from time to time because of covid.
- Our Outdoor London members Exhibition beside the Thames at Putney has proved popular and successful and will be replaced very shortly with "Putney Then and Now"
- The Cafe Art Mentoring programme continued both in person and online with considerable success.
- RPS HQ, other Regions and SIGS have continued their programme of talks with high profile photographers and a particularly strong series of talks and events relating to the Distinctions programme. We endeavour to complement these, not compete with them!



RO's Report – and finally

- The Region is run entirely by volunteers with support from a small staff at HQ.
- Our aims as Regional Organisers are to:
 - to support the strategic aims of the RPS in bringing photography to a wide audience. We do this through running 'open' groups and activities, through our projects and exhibitions.
 - To engage with the London Region Membership and welcome non-Members
 - Most importantly, to help you enjoy and improve your photography (if you wish!) in the company of like-minded individuals
 - And to have fun!

We hope that amongst our varied programme there is and has been something for everyone during the year.

Financial Headlines

- Accounting in the Regions is on a cash basis (reporting is VAT inclusive)
- As at 31 December 2021 the Region had £10,194.39 cash in hand
- Funds allocated to the Region for 2021 amounted to £1,658.80, based on Membership headcount at the beginning of the year. (Reflecting a drop in headcount, if this continues this year we must expect a proportionally smaller contribution).
- Reduced 'in person' events, reflected in reduced income and cost this year.
- Main costs are related to Exhibitions, IT and payment processing.
