

52N 2W Gloucestershire

The confluence point is in a small field directly behind the gardens of some houses in the very pleasant village of Alderton in Gloucestershire, It's relatively easy to find down a signed footpath, between the houses on Orchard Road, and is approximately 300-400 yards from the road.

As is often the case, the intersection isn't that interesting from any angle, so after exploring a few different options, I walked back along the path running along the edge of the adjacent field to find my shot on the edge of the next field. The shapes of the scalped branches of the trees in the foreground, the line of the neatly-trimmed bramble hedge beyond and the rows of bean seedlings in the field leading up to Oak Hill, all seemed to me to provide a bit more interest.

When taking the shot, I was standing at 51.999764 N and 1.998351 W, facing due North and approximately 120 yards from the intersection, which is to the left of the image in a westerly direction. The sun had risen around 6.35 am to my right and this shot was taken around 7am.
